A message from the Rev'd Canon Nicki Bland

Dear Friends,

I often use rosemary at baptisms and confirmations to sprinkle water over those around, it is also an ancient symbol of remembrance and is used at funerals and Remembrance Sunday.

I have a large rosemary bush in my front garden which I use for these occasions, but I also use it when cooking. Many think that rosemary is named after Mary, partly because of the stories I am going to tell you but it's real name 'Rosmarinus officinalis' means 'Rose of the Sea Shore'.

One story tells how Mary washed Jesus' clothes and put them on the bushes to dry. When she collected the washing, little blue flowers to match her gown, appeared all over the bushes.

Another story which is less well known says that when it was time for Mary and Joseph to leave the stable in Bethlehem, the Bible tells us that Joseph had a dream and, in that dream, God told him not to go back home the way they came but go through Egypt. Herod was trying to capture Jesus. Joseph was very afraid, and he and Mary set off on the long journey trying to keep out of sight of the Herod's soldiers. Mary was very tired and begged Joseph to stop. Joseph wasn't keen because he thought the soldiers might catch up with them. But Mary pleaded and, eventually, they stopped. She got down from her donkey and as she walked towards the big rosemary bushes at the side of the road to find some shade, they opened their branches so Mary could walk through them easily. Well away from the road Mary sat down, and the bushes closed around her. Not even Joseph could see her. They were all able to rest safe in the knowledge that if Herod's soldiers appeared there would be no woman and child with the donkey. They were safe. Joseph relaxed, for as long as there were rosemary bushes, Mary and Joseph would be safe.

There are many myths around the story of the birth of Jesus but the two accounts in the Gospels are short and to the point.

We love to celebrate the birth of Christ and you will see from the table of services and, in the card you receive through your door, the services we have for you do just that this Christmas.

We love seeing you at this festive time. In addition, we have four Advent Tuesday afternoons of fellowship in different places in the Benefice where there will be a short act of worship, a look at part of the Advent story and then refreshments. hopefully some mince pies and a cup of tea or coffee. If you are interested, please look on the website. You don't have to come to them all.
