

#### Dear Friends

I have just come back from the most beautiful of walks. The fields were frozen over and glistened in the sun. The moon was still visible, and the sky was such a fantastic pink, orange and clear blue.

Each and every one of us needs to play our part to reduce our carbon footprints and in doing so to preserve our countryside for our children and grandchildren.

It may be something that we as Christians might link to our Lenten activities next month. Christians have always believed that we are stewards of the earth and this is linked to our understanding of the Genesis stories where it is set out that we have responsibility for the natural created world. It was a bit of an experiment because we held it on Zoom, as Covid infections were rising again, and we did not want to put anyone at risk, just before Christmas. The evening was arranged and compered by Alex Turner, from St Andrew's Church, Great Staughton and, thanks to all the excellent performers who took part, the audience enjoyed a wide variety of music, readings, poetry, singing, and puppetry, with a terrific vein of humour running throughout the evening.

On behalf of the Restoration Group, I would like to thank everyone who took part – the performers who provided first-class entertainment, in spite of the difficulties of performing from home on Zoom, the audience who joined us for the evening, the very generous supporters who made donations, and the Rev. Nicki Bland, who hosted the whole event for us. It was a memorable and extremely enjoyable evening, and we were thrilled to find that it raised £360 for the Restoration project. Thank you all very much indeed.

And talking of the Restoration Project, I am thrilled to tell you that at long last, after numerous setbacks, work on Phase 1 of the Restoration will begin on Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> January. The first phase will be to provide muchneeded disabled access. The North Door is likely to be out of action for about six weeks, but the life of the church will continue, and access will be by the South Door, whilst the work is going on. It is really exciting to see our dreams begin to come true. There is a long way to go to complete the whole project, but it is a start!
